Pyramid	Ancient masonry structures located in Egypt. Most were built as tombs for the country's pharaoh.
Sarcophagus	A coffin or a container to hold a coffin used to bury leaders and wealthy residents.
Sphinx	Giant sculptures built to guard important areas such as tombs and temples.
Irrigation	Allowed the Egyptians to use the Nile's waters for a variety of purposes, such as growing food.
Afterlife	What the Egyptians believed happened after death, they journeyed to the underworld.

Hieroglyphs	The formal writing system used in Ancient Egypt, used for writing the Egyptian language.
